The Corporate Confession of Sin

“Merciful Father, we humble ourselves before your great Majesty against which we have frequently and grievously sinned. We acknowledge that we deserve nothing less than eternal death. We are unclean before you.

We continually transgress your commandments, failing to do what you have commanded us to do, and doing that which you have expressly forbidden.

We acknowledge our waywardness and are heartily sorry for our sins. We confess that our iniquities are innumerable. We know that our debt is so great that we could never repay it.

But we know, O Lord, that you do not desire the death of the sinner, but rather that he should turn to you and live. We call upon you in repentance, trusting in our Mediator, Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world.

Have mercy upon us. Forgive us our transgressions. Wash us in the pure fountain of Christ's blood. Cover us with his innocence and righteousness.

This we ask through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.”
