**For reflection this week,
Question 168 of the Westminster Larger Catechism**

168 Q. *What is the Lord's supper?*

A. The Lord's Supper is a sacrament of the new testament,¹ where in, by giving and receiving bread and wine according to the appointment of Jesus Christ, his death is showed forth; and they that worthily communicate feed upon his body and blood, to their spiritual nourishment and growth in grace;² have their union and communion with him confirmed;³ testify and renew their thankfulness,⁴ and engagement to God,⁵ and their mutual love and fellowship each with other, as members of the same mystical body.⁶
