**For reflection on the resurrection of Jesus Christ,
Question 100 and 101 of the Westminster Larger Catechism**

100 Q. *What special things are we to consider in the Ten Commandments?*

A. We are to consider, in the Ten Commandments, the preface, the substance of the commandments themselves, and several reasons annexed to some of them, the more to enforce them.¹

101 Q. *What is the preface to the Ten Commandments?*

A. The preface to the Ten Commandments is contained in these words, I am the LORD thy God, which have brought thee out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage.² Wherein God manifesteth his sovereignty, as being JEHOVAH, the eternal, immutable, and almighty God;³ having his being in and of himself,⁴ and giving being to all his words⁴ and works:⁵ and that he is a God in covenant, as with Israel of old, so with all his people;⁶ who, as he brought them out of their bondage in Egypt, so he delivereth us from our spiritual thralldom;⁷ and that therefore we are bound to take him for our God alone, and to keep all his commandments.⁸

“But who do you say that I am? Jesus's question (Matt.16:15) is as crucial now as it was then. This is the question we will be asking pastors and leaders in the Dominican Republic this week. As Mark Jones expressed, "The correct answer to that question is, in some respects, simple enough for a child to be saved, but also complex enough to keep theologians busy for all eternity."

I will return to the Dominican Republic and together with Chuck, teach the *"Doctrine of Christ."* How humbling and beautifully glorious! Your prayers are needed! Please pray...

1. That Peter's response, *"You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God,"* would be ours as well.
2. That the Spirit would enable us to unpack the significance of the truth in Matt.16:16 as we ponder the depths of revealed mystery with humility.
3. That Christology would result in Doxology in the hearts and mouths of the pastors/leaders we teach.
4. That God would grant us safety and good health as we travel and teach.

We will finish teaching *"Doctrine of Christ"* on Saturday, but stay until the following Wednesday in order to observe, encourage and assist select leaders ("Timothys") who will teach this same course to a different group of pastors and leaders. These first generation "Timothys" will teach a second generation of "Timothys." Please pray for these pastor/leaders who will teach.
