The Shorter Catechism Questions 88, 93, and 96:

- **88. Q.** What are the outward and ordinary means whereby Christ communicateth to us the benefits of redemption?
 - **A.** The outward and ordinary means whereby Christ communicateth to us the benefits of redemption, are his ordinances, especially the Word, sacraments, and prayer; all which are made effectual to the elect for salvation.
- **93 Q.** Which are the sacraments of the New Testament?
 - **A.** The sacraments of the New Testament are baptism and the Lord's supper.
- **96 Q.** What is the Lord's supper?
 - **A.** The Lord's supper is a sacrament, wherein, by giving and receiving bread and wine according to Christ's appointment, his death is showed forth; and the worthy receivers are, not after a corporal and carnal manner, but by faith, made partakers of his body and blood, with all his benefits, to their spiritual nourishment and growth in grace.
