The Corporate Confession of Sin

“Heavenly Father, eternal and merciful God, we acknowledge and confess before your divine Majesty that we are poor miserable sinners, conceived and born in sin and corruption, prone to all evil, and unfit for any good. By our sinful lives, we have continually transgressed your holy commandments, provoked your wrath against us, and incurred your just judgment to eternal death. But, O Lord, we repent in sorrow that we have thus offended you. We implore you mercifully to help us in our wretchedness and misery. Have mercy upon us, therefore, O most gracious God and Father, and pardon all our sins, for the sake of your dear Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. And grant to us, henceforth, the grace of your Holy Spirit, that He may teach us heartily to know our unrighteousness, that sin may be slain in us, and that we may arise to newness of

life. Thus shall we produce the perfect fruits of holiness and righteousness with which, for Christ's sake, You are well pleased. Amen." (adapted from the *Liturgy of Heidelberg*, 1563)

The Assurance of Pardon

"For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you might follow in his steps. He committed no sin, neither was deceit found in his mouth. When he was reviled, he did not revile in return; when he suffered, he did not threaten, but continued entrusting himself to him who judges justly. He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed. For you were straying like sheep, but have now returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls." (1 Peter 2:21-25)

The Corporate Reading of the Law

"Know this, my beloved brothers: let every person be quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger; for the anger of man does not produce the righteousness of God. Therefore put away all filthiness and rampant wickedness and receive with meekness the implanted word, which is able to save your souls. But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who looks intently at his natural face in a mirror. For he looks at himself and goes away and at once forgets what he was like. But the one who looks into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and perseveres, being no hearer who forgets but a doer who acts, he will be blessed in his doing." (James 1:19-25)

**For reflection this week,
Questions 7-9 of the Heidelberg Catechism**

7. Q. *From where, then, did man's depraved nature come?*

A. A. From the fall and disobedience of our first parents, Adam and Eve, in Paradise,[1] for there our nature became so corrupt [2] that we are all conceived and born in sin.[3]

8. Q. *But are we so corrupt that we are totally unable to do any good and inclined to all evil?*

A. Yes,[1] unless we are regenerated by the Spirit of God.[2]

9. Q. *Is God, then, not unjust by requiring in His law what man cannot do?*
