Westminster Larger Catechism Q. 174: *What is required of them that receive the sacrament of the Lord's Supper in the time of the administration of it?*

A. It is required of them that receive the sacrament of the Lord's Supper, that, during the time of the administration of it, with all holy reverence and attention they wait upon God in that ordinance, diligently observe the sacramental elements and actions, heedfully discern the Lord's body, and affectionately meditate on his death and sufferings, and thereby stir up themselves to a vigorous exercise of their graces; in judging themselves, and sorrowing for sin; in earnest hungering and thirsting after Christ, feeding on him by faith, receiving of his fullness, trusting in his merits, rejoicing in his love, giving thanks for his grace; in renewing of their covenant with God, and love to all the saints.

**For reflection this week,
Questions 10 and 11 of the Heidelberg Catechism**

10 Q. Does God permit such disobedience and rebellion to go unpunished?

A. Certainly not. God is terribly angry with the sin we are born with as well as the sins we personally commit.

As a just judge, God will punish them both now and in eternity,¹

having declared: “Cursed is everyone who does not observe and obey all the things written in the book of the law.”²

11 Q. But isn't God also merciful?

A. God is certainly merciful,¹
but also just.²

God's justice demands that sin, committed against his supreme majesty, be punished with the supreme penalty—
eternal punishment of body and soul.³
