- September 5-6 The West Texas Conference on Reformed Theology: Our conference theme is on Covenant Theology and is entitled "Covenant and Salvation: God's Faithful Promises." Our speaker is Dr. John Fesko, the Harriet Barbour Professor of Systematic and Historical Theology at Reformed Theological Seminary, Jackson (Mississippi). Dr. Fesko earned his PhD at the University of Aberdeen (Scotland) and has been an ordained minister since 1998 in the Orthodox Presbyterian Church, serving as a church planter, pastor, and now teacher. Dr. Fesko's interests include early modern Reformation and post-Reformation theology, the integration of biblical and systematic theology, as well as soteriology, especially the doctrine of justification. Dr. Fesko has authored or edited more than twenty books and written fifty published essays for various journals and books. He recently published *Signed, Sealed, and Delivered: An Introduction to Covenant Theology* with Ligonier Ministries.

The Heidelberg Catechism Q. 65: *It is by faith alone that we share in Christ and all his benefits: Where then does that faith come from?*

A. The Holy Spirit works it in our hearts by the preaching of the holy gospel, and confirms it by the use of the holy sacraments.

Q. 66: *What are sacraments?*

A. Sacraments are visible, holy signs and seals. They were instituted by God so that by our use of them he might make us understand more clearly the promise of the gospel, and seal that promise. And this is God’s gospel promise: he grants us forgiveness of sins and eternal life because of Christ’s one sacrifice accomplished on the cross.
