He serves on the General Council of the Gospel Reformation Network and trains a growing network of Reformed and Presbyterian house church leaders in a large east Asian country.

Our speaker is Dr. John Fesko (Ph.D., University of Aberdeen, Scotland), the Harriet Barbour Professor of Systematic and Historical Theology at Reformed Theological Seminary in Jackson, MS, and a minister in the Orthodox Presbyterian Church. He previously served as a church planter, pastor, and as academic dean at Westminster Seminary California. He's the author of many books, including *The Need for Creeds Today*, *The Theology of the Westminster Standards*, *Romans*, and *Signed, Sealed, and Delivered: An Introduction to Covenant Theology* with Ligonier Ministries.

The Corporate Confession of Sin

The Assurance of Pardon
