For reflection this week, Questions 16 and 17 of the Heidelberg Catechism:

17 Q. Why must the mediator also be true God?

A. So that the mediator,

by the power of his divinity, might bear the weight of God's wrath in his humanity and earn for us and restore to us righteousness and life.³
