The Corporate Confession of Sin

“Merciful Father, we humble ourselves before your great Majesty against which we have frequently and grievously sinned. We are unclean before you. We continually transgress your commandments, failing to do what you’ve commanded us to do,

and doing that which you've expressly forbidden. We acknowledge our waywardness, and are heartily sorry for our sins. We confess that our iniquities are innumerable. We know that our debt is so great that we could never repay it. But we know, O Lord, that you do not desire the death of the sinner, but rather that he should turn to you and live. We call upon you in repentance, trusting in our Mediator, Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. Have mercy upon us. Forgive us our transgressions. Wash us in the pure fountain of Christ's blood. Cover us with his righteousness. This we ask through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen." (adapted from the *Dutch Reformed Psalter*, 1566)

The Assurance of Pardon

"Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. For one will scarcely die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die—but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God." (Romans 5:1, 7-9)

The Corporate Reading of the Law

"But as for you, teach what accords with sound doctrine. Older men are to be sober-minded, dignified, self-controlled, sound in faith, in love, and in steadfastness. Older women likewise are to be reverent in behavior, not slanderers or slaves to much wine. They are to teach what is good, and so train the young women to love their husbands and children, to be self-controlled, pure, working at home, kind, and submissive to their own husbands, that the word of God may not be reviled. Likewise, urge the younger men to be self-controlled. Show yourself in all respects to be a model of good works, and in your teaching show integrity, dignity, and sound speech that cannot be condemned, so that an opponent may be put to shame, having nothing evil to say about us." (Titus 2:1-8)

In preparation for the Evening Service
Question 107 of the Westminster Shorter Catechism:

Q. 107. *What does the conclusion of the Lord's Prayer teach us?*

A. The conclusion of the Lord's Prayer, which is, *For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen*, teaches us to take our encouragement in prayer from God only,¹ and in our prayers to praise him, ascribing kingdom, power, and glory to him;² and, in testimony of our desire, and assurance to be heard, we say, Amen.³
